MAKE MUSIC, SWEET MUSIC, THIS SUMMER!



AN ANSWER TO PRAYER

A member of our congregation who is her spouse's care-giver, recently related this experience to me, and has given me her permission to share it.

Because of cognitive decline, my husband who at one time had a great love for the Word of God, and spent much time studying it, no longer touched his Bible. So I decided to take this matter up with the Lord, and simply asked Him:
